


Diving with purpose

For nearly 3 decades, Reef Check has been empowering people worldwide to save our oceans and create a sustainable future through education, research, and conservation.

In 2006, we brought the same strategy to California where Reef Check helps ensure the long-term sustainability and health of the nearshore rocky reefs and kelp forests.

We train scuba divers to be citizen scientists familiar with local marine life and how to survey kelp forests, providing them with the skills to conduct scientific surveys and leading them in monitoring kelp forests along the West Coast of North America.

Reef Check volunteer citizen scientists are divers, fishermen, kayakers, surfers, boaters, and a wide range of people who take a proactive role in making sure that our nearshore ecosystems are healthy and well managed.



California is an important piece of the worldwide marine ecosystem puzzle

Kelp forests provide the habitat, food, and refuge that wildlife needs to thrive, and they create a beautiful backdrop for ocean recreation, whether through scuba diving, kayaking, or just enjoying the beach and tidepools.



We monitor kelp forests inside and outside of California's marine protected areas (MPAs). We work with marine managers, researchers, and the public to provide scientific data needed to make informed, science-based decisions for the sustainable management and conservation of California's ocean.

Last year we trained more than **200 citizen scientists** to survey kelp forests at more than 130 sites across California.



Using the power of citizen science, we offer cost-effective solutions that fill gaps in knowledge about kelp forests and empower communities to actively understand, manage, and protect their local reef resources.

We provide a trusted and inclusive approach to engaging volunteers, collecting long-term kelp forest health data, educating communities, restoring kelp forests, and delivering on-ground action.

What does Reef Check do to support kelp forests in CA?



We train and lead volunteer citizen scientists to conduct long-term monitoring at 130+ sites, from Del Norte to San Diego. This information is crucial to understanding long-term trends and the overall health of kelp forests and to devise action to protect and restore them.



We have several restoration projects underway at sites in Mendocino and Monterey counties where we are experimentally testing different urchin removal methods to restore kelp forests.



Our data is made freely available to anyone who requests it to make informed, evidence-based conservation and policy recommendations for managing these natural resources.



We aim to increase diversity and environmental justice by fostering the next generation of diverse marine scientists through our Dive into Science education program.
